Social Media (Adults)	Risk of harm caused by member of school personnel accessing / circulating inappropriate material	Robust firewall and network security system in place in the school. Clear policy for school personnel in the use of social media for personal purposes in school.
On-line teaching	Potential for sexual abuse, emotional abuse, grooming and peer-on-peer abuse.	Any online sessions will be provided by / monitored by the teacher. Any pre-recorded lessons will be made by / vetted by the teacher.

Important Note: It should be noted that risk in the context of this risk assessment is the risk of "harm" as defined in the Children First Act 2015 and not genera health and safety risk. The definition of harm is set out in Chapter 4 of the *Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post- Primary Schools (revised 2023)*

In undertaking this risk assessment, the board of management has endeavoured to identify as far as possible the risks of harm that are relevant to this school and to ensure that adequate procedures are in place to manage all risks identified. While it is not possible to foresee and remove all risk of harm, the school has in place the procedures listed in this risk assessment to manage and reduce risk to the greatest possible extent.
